Scripps Ranch Planning Group (SRPG) and Miramar Ranch North Planning Committee (MRNPC)

Purpose/Mission: SRPG and MRNPC are two of 42 Community Planning Groups in the City of San Diego. SRPG's area of responsibility is the southern part of Scripps Ranch and all of Rancho Encantada/ Stonebridge Estates. MRNPC is responsible for the northern part of Scripps Ranch. Both groups are separate and independent from the SRCA, but all three work closely together. They make recommendations to the Mayor, City Council, Planning Commission, City staff and other agencies on matters concerning the General Plan or land use plans related to each planning group's area boundaries.

General description of activities and events held or sponsored by the organization: Both groups work with City staff to formulate and implement the General Plan and community plans, and to advise the Planning Commission and City Council on projects affecting things such as Land Use; Mobility - a balanced multi-modal transportation network; Urban Design; Economic Prosperity; Public Facilities, Services and Safety; Recreation; Conservation; Historic Preservation; Noise; and Housing.

Membership requirements and dues: No dues. Members of the Planning Groups are volunteers elected to two-year terms by the community. Elections are held annually. In general candidates for election must have attended at least two previous meetings in the 12 months prior to election.

San Diego Community Emergency Response Team (CERT)

Purpose/Mission: Firefighters and citizens working together to build safer communities

General description of activities and events held or sponsored by the organization: San Diego Fire-Rescue personnel train and empower citizens in safe, effective neighborhood CERT teams. CERT San Diego instructors teach citizens to take life-saving action to help families, neighbors, businesses and communities get through the first few hours or days when emergency services are overwhelmed.

Membership requirements and dues: To join our CERT team, you must live within the city limits of San Diego (this does not include Chula Vista, Del Mar, Poway, or Imperial Beach, for example). Next, please sign up to attend one of our academies. Applications are on our web site. Academies are held one to two times per year and have limited seating. Once the dates are announced and the registration form is released, seats are assigned on a first come, first served basis for City of San Diego residents. If all the seats are not filled by City of San Diego residents, then applicants from outside the city will be given available seats on the first day of the academy.

Scripps Ranch Fire Safe Council

Purpose/Mission: The Chimney Canyon Fire Safe Council began as a group of concerned homeowners after the devastating Cedar wildfire on October 26, 2003 destroyed 312 homes in Scripps Ranch. We soon discovered the statewide California Fire Safe Council-and formed the first urban chapter of the FSC in San Diego County. Our initial mission was to clear the volatile ground fuel and create a firebreak for our neighborhood (Wine Country). Early in 2004 we incorporated as a 501(c)(3) charitable organization. In January 2005, we teamed with the Scripps Ranch Civic Association, changed our name, and extended our mission to include all of Scripps Ranch, a 12,000-home community. In July 2005, we formed an alliance with twelve Federal, State, and Civic organizations to promote wildfire prevention in Scripps Ranch.

General description of activities and events held or sponsored by the organization: The Scripps Ranch Fire Safe Council holds expositions, classes, and other events to inform the community about fire-safe practices. At present, we are working closely with the San Diego City Police and Fire Departments to identify and prepare emergency equipment for our community's emergency evacuation routes. Our primary funding is through periodic grants and our annual "PLAY TO PROTECT" Charity Golf Tournament.
