I make a lot of decisions as your representative at City Hall so I want to be sure you are up to date on what we have been working on. Below please find some news headlines reflecting the current issues:

City Releases First Long-term Infrastructure Report

As Chair of the Infrastructure Committee I have been calling for the creation of a long-term infrastructure investment report to finally get a handle on the backlog of deferred maintenance and repairs on everything from streets and sidewalks to storm drains and water mains. It put a startling \$3.8 billion price tag on our infrastructure needs over the next five years. My takeaway - we need to find more resources to meet our unfunded needs of more than \$1.7 billion. This year, my top priority is to put together a financing plan we can bring to voters for support in 2016 so we can Rebuild San Diego. In the meantime, we will continue to streamline processes, reduce costs and invest more from our general fund. [Read more...](#)

My Budget Priorities Memo

At the start of the year, each councilmember releases their budget priorities in a memo to the City's Internal Budget Analyst. I thought I would share mine with you so you could see my priority projects for District Five requiring funding this year. Among them: more street lights in Rancho Bernardo, storm drain replacement in Scripps Ranch, ADA upgrades at Rolling Hills Park and Jerabek Park, and repairing San Ysabel Road in the San Pasqual Valley. Other priorities: increased funding for police recruitment and retention, adding a Fast Response Squad to the San Pasqual Valley and additional funds for brush management. [Read more...](#)
