Organic Waste Recycling Program Coming to Scripps Ranch

Scripps Ranch residents will soon be able to make a significant impact on climate change by diverting their organic waste from the landfill. In compliance with state requirements, new green bins and kitchen pails will be delivered to City-serviced residents, with service expected to begin in Scripps Ranch in July. Business, condominiums and apartment complexes will receive bins and have their schedule set by the private hauler providing their regular trash collection.

Senate Bill 1383 requires residents and businesses to reduce the disposal of organic waste (food scraps, food-soiled paper and yard trimmings) by 75 percent by 2025. When organic waste decomposes in a landfill, it releases methane, a harmful gas that traps the sun's heat and contributes to climate change.

While the San Diego rollout began in January, it will take until mid-2023 to complete. For a list of what can go in the green bin and more information, visit sandiego.gov/OrganicWasteRecycling. Residents served by City trash collection will also find a schedule of bin delivery on that website. Businesses and Scripps Ranch residents living in condominiums or apartment complexes should contact their regular provider of trash pickup for their schedule and more information.
