### IV. ACTION AND DISCUSSION ITEMS

- A. Alert: San Diego City Housing Action Package – Discussion of Livable San Diego lawsuit. Movement to repeal SB 10. Interest by board for a presentation on the issues.
- B. Appointment of Secretary nomination of Jason Minter (Action item) – Approved 14-0-1. Term is 2022-2024.
- C. SRCA President's Report
  - 1. Moment of silence for Christine Millay

2. Assist homeowner with storm drain failure behind her home on Negley Avenue. Storm drain runs along the side of her home on to the slope above Pomerado Road. Occured over a month ago and no one from the city has contacted her. Working with City Council office to get a point of contact for the homeowner as this could be a 2-3 year process based on the Rue Chantemar and Spring Canyon Water Tank incidents.
3. Communicated with Park Dpt MAD Assistant Director on updating the community about Summerwood Court - Jerabek Park storm drain failure. Emergency declaration and funding. Work should begin next Monday conditioned on not finding an engineering issue. If so then 6 week delay. Updated SRLL as J9 baseball field is reopened and will remain open during construction. The vast majority of the construction will be on Summerwood Court.
4. 04/05/23 The SRCA hosted a NW block meeting in Sabre Springs that was a result of the 3 burglaries in MRN. Over 30 residents attended. Email us if you want to host a block meeting in your neighborhood. We make all the arrangements. Easy to do.
5. Found resources and provide guidance to SR family whose father was a victim of identity theft and how to report the devastating loss. They drained his savings of \$158,000.
6. Engaged city traffic engineering with a resident request to add crosswalks to SRB and Aviary. City re-evaluated a previous request and came with the same conclusion it is not warranted.
7. Provided supplies and labor to document, report and remove several graffiti taggings on Legacy Terrace near Pomerado Road. The HOA is grateful. Also removed graffiti at Spring Canyon Park volleyball court, 3 taggings on the play equipment at Hoyt Park and 4 taggings at Hoyt Park. The SRCA pays for the paint supplies. If you see graffiti or vandalism, please email me immediately. The faster we remove it the less it happens. Taggers get tired, we don't!
8. Speaking of Hoyt Park. Three trees fell and another one in Hoyt Park East. Notified the SR MAD Grounds Manager who arranged the tree removals. One of the trees damaged a drinking fountain which a neighbor came to the rescue to shut off the water. Of course it happened after 5 pm.
9. Persisted in getting the city water department to investigate and repair two water line breaks. One of them they said was runoff and pressured them to return to ultimately agree that it was a broken water line.
10. Recruited 23 residents for SDUSD active assailant training for Federal Law Enforcement Training Center. Instructors from regional training center in New Mexico were here all week giving instructions to 23 law enforcement officers cummalinating in qualifications last Friday. Active assailant training was at MMS. The officers went through the scenarios once while our

wonderful volunteers did each scenario 23 times! Thank you to Shauna for being a volunteer.

11. Arranged to have city water department repair broken water line on Scripps Lake Drive at Timberlake Drive. Same location as a previous repair.

12. The eyeglasses and cell phone collection efforts are going really well. Entered into a partnership with The Glen SR to have a collection station for us.

13. Should have a report next month on an ongoing issue of parking on Chabad Driveway that residents of The Glen SR say is unsafe. Investigating how much of the Chabad Driveway should be red curbed as fire lane. The vehicles parked at night are from Campus of Life. Could be an issue for first responders as well.

14. Park Dept Brush Management Division began brush thinning on city owned open space. A biologist will mark the 100 foot from back of habitable structures and identify plant materials to cut. It is not clearing or weed whacking. A landscape contractor will follow the biologist. Sometimes it takes 2-3 weeks for the landscape company to return to pick up the cut plant material. Happy to send you the brush management regulations. The work will continue until the bird nesting season and then pick up after that. Expect residents to see blue and orange ribbons on fences. Also portapotty for the contractors will move throughout the community where the work is being done.

15. 4th of July Parade planning is happening now.

16. April 24th is the District 5 community digital forum on street resurfacing. Originally the SRCA asked to host and the city thought it would be more equitable for the forum to include all of District 5. City staff will explain the street resurfacing process and we will provide them lists of streets in SR that need repairs. Link to attend will be out shortly. Apparently the Pure Water contractor grinded down the temporary asphalt on Miramar Road. Much improved!

17. Do you have unused medication? The SRCA is hosting our first ever prescription drop off event on April 29th at the SRCA Community Center. We partnered with SD Castles Realty, SDPD and Falck. You can't put prescriptions in the trash or down the drains so instead of driving to the PQ police substation, we will have curbside drop off here in SR. 8 am to 2 pm Saturday April 29th.
