- I. Meeting called to order at 4:33 by Chair Jenny Cornelissen

- II. Approval of minutes
 - Revised October minutes: Angelia Watkins motions to approve, Gail Faber seconds; Approved
 - November minutes: Josh Way motions to approve, Gail Faber seconds; Approved

- III. Area Superintendent Update by Monika Hazel
 - EBS named 2023 Distinguished School!
 - The only elementary school to get this distinction this year.
 - SR Principals are collaborating in a cycle of continuous improvement
 - Action Learning research on improving outcomes for all students
 - Goal of differentiated learning
 - Potential to report out at upcoming meeting

- IV. Parent Organization and School Foundation Engagement updates
 - A. Dingeman Elementary - Cathryn McFearin

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- Volunteers are back in classrooms and special events and programs such as art, STEAM, science night, art night, halloween boo bash have returned
 - Planning for Jog-A-Thon and spring Carnival ongoing, loss of seasoned volunteers means that events are being re-thought and re-designed
 - Trying new ways to connect and build community such as grade level playdates
- B. Ellen Browning Scripps Elementary - Liz Sloan for Nina Jacobs
- Drop off in volunteering during pandemic, now rebuilding
 - Loss of institutional knowledge is a challenge, but also an opportunity for growth
 - Great turnout and enthusiasm for returning events such as grade level science nights, halloween carnival, book fair, art show, and more
 - Pledge drive was very successful
- C. Jerabek Elementary - Sharon Camarillo
- Classroom volunteer presence is very strong, but still need volunteers to lead committees and big events like the upcoming Ranch Round Up
 - Re-evaluating and re-examining practices to make things easier for volunteers - combined math and science nights for each grade level
 - Trying to be more equity-minded and inclusive:
 - Used a lottery system for family art night admission so that everyone had an equal chance to participate
 - Changing to VIP night instead of Father/Daughter and Mother/Son nights
 - Shout out to Treasurer Vanessa Neville for keeping finances on track during COVID
- D. Miramar Ranch Elementary - Rochelle Fine
- Halloween carnival returned for the first time since COVID – 1600 attendees!!
 - In person classroom volunteering going well, harder to find committee volunteers
 - Working on messaging for parents to help encourage new volunteers – what the events are, why they are happening, and what it means to be a volunteer
 - Book Fair, Jog-A-Thon upcoming, second time hosting popular Me and My VIP event; working to share practices for these big events with other schools/foundations
- E. Marshall Middle School - Kelly Melancon
- Pledge drive was way down in 2020, up in 2021, and now back down
 - Return of 6th Grade camp!!
 - Lots of teacher appreciation events led by Gail Faber
 - 8th grade promotion party returned last year and was held on campus, plan is to continue that new tradition this year
- F. Scripps Ranch High School - Gail Faber for Rich Lawson
- Senior Grad night at Disneyland again this year
 - Taste of the Ranch returning this year on April 21st
 - Pledge drive better than expected - Principal Lawson reports teachers are very happy with the support and the supplies funded by pledge drive
 - College Fair series on Wed thanks to Ginger Colletto. Over 100 colleges on campus this year. Now moving on to Wed career series.

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V. Legislative Analyst Update by Tamara Hurley

- Prop 28 passed in November, provides stable, dedicated arts & music funding.
 - The new funding is based on enrollment and allocated on a per pupil basis.
 - Can only be spent on arts & music education that supplements, not supplants, current programs.
 - 80% must be spent on hiring instructors
 - Starts in 2023-2024
- Principals are starting to meet now to create budgets for next year and to figure out how to incorporate this new funding stream.
- SDUSD guidelines are coming. Russ Sperling could provide update at a future meeting.

VI. Standard Operating Procedures: Proposed Motion to Revise

- Current SOP outdated with 2 SRCA positions that are part of larger committees. Proposal to replace these voting spots by giving official voting rights to SRCA Chair and SRCA Secretary.

The SRCASC shall also have ~~two~~ **four** additional voting members, who would act as the Chair, Secretary, Legislative Advisor and the Parliamentarian for the SRASC. People filling ~~either~~ **any** of these ~~two~~ **four** positions should be Scripps Ranch community members. A person may represent one of the organizations listed above and also hold the position of either Chair, Secretary, Legislative Advisor or Parliamentarian. In addition, upon the concurrence of the then-current SRCASC membership, a school district representative may also be invited to sit on the SRCASC in an advisory capacity for the then-current term of office.
