### Meeting Minutes:

- I. Meeting called to order at 4:34 by Chair Jenny Cornelissen
  - a. Zoom option available for those unable to attend in person (noted above).
  - b. Next meeting scheduled for Sept 20, 2023.
    - i. Plan is to have first meeting on-line and then host one in-person meeting in the fall in October or November to allow time for SSC/SGT reps to be selected and one in-person meeting at the end of the year in May.
- II. Approval of April minutes
  - a. April minutes were modified after first circulation to clarify resolution language.
  - b. Christina Liu motions to approve the modified April minutes; Shannon Kellogg seconds; all in favor; motion passes.

- III. STEM Lab Update by Area Superintendent Monika Hazel
  - a. Finished walkthroughs of local school science departments - most schools already have a maker space/STEM lab.

- b. Working with teachers to identify how to make space different and create something that the community will benefit from.
- c. Focus will be in an area of science not currently in the schools ie, biology/green science.
- d. Looking for business partnerships.
- e. Goal will be to use space to facilitate bringing students from different area elementary schools together with possible mentorship opportunities for older students.

### IV. Update by Deputy Superintendent Fabiola Bagula

- a. Trying to stay more connected to schools.
- b. Offers thank you/flowers to Chair Jenny Cornelissen for her leadership this year.

### V. End of year school updates and summer programs

- a. Dingeman update by Dusty Pedrotti
  - i. First full year in person and lots of great events including art show with 740 families and upcoming spring carnival (June 2<sup>nd</sup>).
  - ii. Summer school site – 600 enrolled including 200 UTK/K students, prioritized students with IEPs. Also offering Level Up, SAY, and Science and Art Camps (camps open to all).
- b. EBS update by Liz Sloan
  - i. Lots of activities including the return of the Food Services family BBQ, spring open house, art fair, spring dance.
  - ii. Excited about progress of “Leader in Me” program happening at EBS and other SR elementary schools.
  - iii. Offering Level Up camps on site this summer.
- c. Jerabek update by Angelia Watkins
  - i. Hosting summer school with 200 UTK/TK students—need more staff for these grade levels; VP will be in charge for summer.
  - ii. 2<sup>nd</sup> year of Leader in Me is very successful, used by whole staff.
  - iii. Creating school Mission and Vision statements starting at classroom level with mission for the classroom.
  - iv. Student Lighthouse Leaders – 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> graders interviewed 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> graders that made final round after video submission to select next year’s Lighthouse Leaders and Jr. Lighthouse Leaders.
  - v. Equity a focus.
    - 1. Diversity in Art was theme of Art Show – brought in art from around the globe.
    - 2. VIP night instead of Father/Daughter or Mother/Son events with Central Park theme (a hit with families).
  - vi. Hey Tutor program – looking to offer as a paid program going forward.
  - vii. Primetime, free afterschool program, to be added.
  - viii. Celebrating Parent volunteers before end of school year.

- d. Miramar Ranch by Carolyn Kalicki
  - i. There is a lot of collaboration between the schools. Miramar Ranch had many programs that other schools also discussed – ie, Leader in Me, Jog-A-Thon, Art Show, Open House.
  - ii. FFA offering lots of free activities for families like movie night, foam party.
  - iii. 5<sup>th</sup> grade celebrations coming soon – new tradition of 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Clap Out where school makes giant tunnel for 5<sup>th</sup> grade.
  - iv. Asphalt resurfacing over the summer.
  - v. Garden needs some attention – hosting weed whacker Saturday this weekend. Look for more opportunities to help out.
  - vi. Hey tutor program has 60 spots for free.
  - vii. District Primetime, free after school care, has 60 spots; also offering a paid program.
- e. Marshall Middle School by Josh Way
  - i. Find your passion event with high school ambassadors last month.
  - ii. Festival of Cultures to celebrate diversity on campus – 39 different languages spoken; offered in partnership with parent DEI council.
  - iii. Library of Us.
  - iv. Added 2 more teachers including VAPA Theater Manager.
  - v. Increasing counselor FTES – social emotional curriculum.
  - vi. Goal for next year – resetting behavior expectations for students.
    - 1. Work on teaching behaviors with Character Ed – “This is What it Means to be a Mustang.”
  - vii. New bell schedule for next year including early release Mondays for teachers to work on grading, alignment & consistency, and planning; every 4<sup>th</sup> Monday will be for student re-assessment.
- f. Scripps Ranch High School by Matt Lawson
  - i. Aaron Ford of Poway Win A Car Giveaway for SRHS students.
  - ii. Prom at Park Nightclub on June 2<sup>nd</sup>.
  - iii. Graduation will have one big LCD screen; Working with video production team to run; Will be live-streamed.
  - iv. Lots of highlights this year --- sports, club, theater, band . . .
  - v. Working on school culture; trying to build community; started last year with “Week of Welcome”; will be amplified next year; working on summer bridging events and culture-building activities.
  - vi. Received an anonymous donation of \$25,000 to support classrooms.
  - vii. Summer school site for SRHS and Mira Mesa students – 1000 students, all 3 VPs will be on site with Amy Hines as lead.
  - viii. Next year goal to catch students that are falling behind/at risk of falling behind with staff mentors – go out and find kids that are struggling.
  - ix. School schedule switching to early out Mondays instead of late start Mondays. Will continue pattern of 2 weeks for teacher development, 2 weeks for student reassessment time.
